HEALTHCARE STUDENT SCHEME, UNIVERSITY MALAYSIA TERENGGANU

1. INTRODUCTION

The Healthcare Student Scheme is aims to provide health and medical services to student to stay healthy and successfully pursue their study at University Malaysia Terengganu. Besides that, as long as being a registered student at UMT, students will have optimum health benefits continuously.

2. QUALIFICATION

Those eligible for this scheme are:

- 2.1 Registered students as interpreted in the University and Colleges Act 1971 who are in active status including diploma, bachelor and post-graduate students.
- 2.2 Students who postpone the study on health reasons certified by government medical officers or the university.

3. NON-ELIGIBLE

Those are not eligible for this scheme are:

- 3.1 Students who fail in the semester examination and are not allowed to pursue their study.
- 3.2 Students who are suspended from being a student of UMT

4. QUALIFICATION PERIOD

Effective on the date of registration until the date of termination as a student.

5. SERVICE FACILITIES

5.1 Student Health Centre (PKU)

5.1.1 Outpatient Clinic

Outpatient treatment according to the schedule set by the university.

5.1.2 Emergency Services

The Student Health Centre provides 24-hour emergency facilities.

5.1.3 Dental Clinic

Dental treatment according to the schedule set by the university.

5.2 Government and University Hospitals

Services provided at government and university hospitals except 'para 8.0'

5.3 Dental Treatment in Panel Clinics

Dental treatment also available at dental clinic appointed by UMT after receiving a reference letter from a medical officer or dental officer at the student health centre.

5.4 Specialist Treatment

5.4.1 Students who require specialist treatment from government hospitals must be referred to or certified by a medical officer or dental officer of the Student's Health Centre.

5.4.2 For the follow-up treatment at the government specialist clinic, it is subject to the confirmation of the relevant medical officer or dental officer of the relevant government hospital.

6. PLACE OF TREATMENT

6.1 The Student Health Centre of University Malaysia Terengganu.

6.2 Health Ministry Malaysia Hospital

6.3 Public University Hospital, Malaysia (IPTA)

7. HEALTH SERVICES INCURRED

7.1 Medical check-up and treatment at:

- 7.1.1 Student Health Centre
- 7.1.2 Outpatient clinics in government hospitals
- 7.1.3 Specialist Medical and Dental clinics at government hospitals, University Hospitals or National Heart Institute (IJN).
- 7.1.4 'Day care' treatment at hospitals and Specialist Medical and Dental Clinics under Ministry of Health, Malaysia, University's hospitals or National Heart Institute.

7.2 Ward eligibility

Second class ward at government hospital or public university hospital (IPTA).

7.3 Treatment Cost

Maximum rate of RM 2,500.00 for admission to ward or every treatment session except with the permission of the Deputy Vice-Chancellor of Student Affairs and Alumni.

8. TREATMENT NOT COVERED BY UMT

University Malaysia Terengganu is not responsible for any fees charged to the student for the following services:

- 8.1 Medical check-up during the admission to UMT.
- 8.2 Family planning services.
- 8.3 Treatment, checks-up, medicines, surgical and hospital admission benefits associated with maternity, childbirth and complications related to it.
- 8.4 Any treatment or test relating to infertility, contraceptives and sterilization procedures.
- 8.5 Fertility treatment and pregnancy-related problems including miscarriage from physiological and social causes. (Infertility treatment)
- 8.6 Medical, surgical and dental supplies such as glasses, hearing aids, false eyes and limbs, dentures, braces, orthodontics, crowns, bridges, implants and others.
- 8.7 Treatment, equipment or surgery to beautify (cosmetic) in relation to ritual purposes, gender transmission surgery and body care.
- 8.8 Treatment at a clinic or private hospital or admission to the first-class ward at government hospital or university hospital of their choice (student).
- 8.9 Treatment at the National Heart Institute (IJN) unless consulted by a specialist from a government hospital or a medical officer at the Student Health Centre.
- 8.10 Treatment for congenital imbalances or physical disabilities that were present at birth.
- 8.11 Alternative or traditional treatments, experimental treatments, mental, psychological or emotional treatments other than the Ministry of Health, Malaysia.
- 8.12 Treatment of admission to a ward which is not recommended by the medical practitioner or not recommended by a registered medical officer in Malaysia.
- 8.13 New treatments as well as extended treatments as a result of new treatments that have not yet been confirmed by Ministry of Health, Malaysia.
- 8.14 Additional immunizations such as hepatitis, typhoid, rubella, mumps, chicken pox and others.
- 8.15 Illness due to direct vision in demonstrations, riots, civil commotion and excessive use of alcohol or drugs.
- 8.16 Medical and health tests required by external parties for purpose of insurance and others.
- 8.17 Treatment of organ/limb transplants such as heart transplantation, kidneys, eyes, bone marrow and so forth.

- 8.18 Supplements include vitamins except for treatment purposes by the Student Medical Officer.
- 8.19 Treatment expenses abroad.

9. LETTER OF MEDICAL CARE (GUARANTEE LETTER)

- 9.1 Students who require medical treatment at government hospitals must first obtain a guarantee letter from the Student Health Centre. Medical care guarantees (Guarantee letter) can only be used for **one treatment/admission only**.
- 9.2 In the case of **emergency**, student can get a guarantee letter during the admission. Students must give full cooperation to the Student Health Centre in order to ensure all treatment charge payments can be completed smoothly.

10. MEDICAL CERTIFICATE AND TIME SLIP

- 10.1 If a student sick and unable to attend to class, he or she should obtain Medical Certificate from a Medical Officer or Dental Officer of the government and Student Health Centre. If the Medical Certificate is obtained from a private clinic, students must get a confirmation from Medical Officer or Dental Officer and the certificate must be submitted to the faculty promptly.
- 10.2 Time Slip will be issued if the student is not eligible for a called certificate for the condition and at the discretion of the Medical Officer and Dental Officer. Time Slip is used as a confirmation of student's presence at the clinic.

11. MEDICAL INSURANCE

- 11.1 International students are **STRICTLY REQUIRED** to take medical insurance for medical care that will be covered at government and private hospitals other than the medical treatment received at the Student Health Centre.

12. GENERAL

- 12.1 The Vice-Chancellor have the right to decide on any unspecified condition or grant an exception to the student for any provision in the scheme.
- 12.2 Any confusion arising from time to time as to the interpretation of any provision of the scheme shall be subjected to the Student Health Centre.
- 12.3 This qualification is for local healthcare. Students are required to take health insurance when he or she are abroad.
