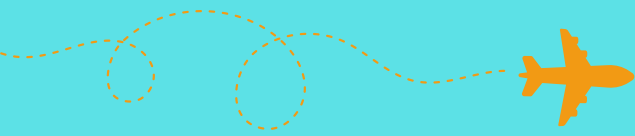

HISTORICAL PLACES



**Terengganu State
Museum**

- **Location:** Kampung Losong, 21000 Kuala Terengganu, Terengganu
- **Distance from UMT:** approximately 20–25 minutes by car

The Terengganu State Museum Complex, located in Kampung Bukit Losong, is the largest museum in Southeast Asia. It was established in 1976 and officially opened on 1 November 1977 as an effort to preserve and showcase the history and cultural heritage of Terengganu. The museum was created through the initiative of the Terengganu state government to document and protect the state's rich artifacts and cultural heritage.

The museum houses the original Batu Bersurat, which was discovered in 1303 in Kampung Buluh, Hulu Terengganu. This stone is important evidence that Terengganu was one of the earliest states to practice Islamic law.

**Kampung Budaya
(Cultural Village)**

Kampung Budaya Terengganu (Terengganu Cultural Village) is a heritage site developed to preserve and showcase traditional Malay lifestyle, architecture, and cultural practices.

Unlike historical sites formed naturally over time, this village was intentionally established as a cultural preservation initiative, especially as modernization began to reduce exposure to traditional ways of life. It functions as a “living museum”, where visitors can experience how communities in Terengganu lived in the past.

The village features:

- Authentic traditional Malay houses from different districts, each representing unique architectural styles
- Demonstrations of traditional crafts, such as batik printing, songket weaving, and wood carving
- Cultural performances, including traditional dance and music
- Exhibitions on daily life, customs, and local traditions

**Kampung Cina
(Chinatown)**

Kampung Cina Kuala Terengganu, also known as Chinatown or Tâng-lâng-pho (唐人坡), is one of the most iconic heritage destinations and a must-visit place in the city. It is located along the Terengganu River and close to Pasar Kedai Payang. Chinatown Kuala Terengganu continues to grow as a cultural, art, and historical tourism spot that attracts both local and international visitors.

This village has existed since the 17th century as a trading center for merchants from Southern China. It is one of the earliest Chinese settlements in Southeast Asia. The settlement was started by Chinese traders who traveled by sea. They chose Kuala Terengganu because of its strategic location at the river mouth. The two-storey wooden and brick shop houses that still stand today reflect Straits Chinese and colonial architectural styles.

The village is recognized as a National Heritage Site and shows the long history of harmony between the Chinese and Malay communities. Visitors can find old shops that have been renovated into restaurants, cafes, and guesthouses, offering a modern experience with traditional elements.

Bukit Puteri

- **Location:** Jalan Sultan Zainal Abidin, Kampung Panglima, 20000 Kuala Terengganu, Terengganu
- **Distance from UMT:** approximately 20–25 minutes by car

Bukit Puteri plays an important role in the history of the Terengganu Sultanate. In the 19th century, especially between 1831 and 1839, this hill served as a main defensive fort during political conflicts. At the top of the hill, there are old cannons, stone fort structures, and a 175-kilogram brass bell built in 1908.

There are many stories about the origin of the hill's name. Historical records show that when Dato' Bendahara Padang Saujana of Johor sent his representative to Terengganu in the 17th century, the hill was already known as Bukit Puteri. However, local legends are more popular among the community. According to the story, the hill was once home to a fairy princess (puteri bunian). Villagers would borrow plates and utensils from her for feasts. In the end, the princess became upset and disappeared because some people did not return the items or returned them damaged. It is said that she later moved to Besut, where there is another hill also called Bukit Puteri.

Pasar Kedai Payang

Pasar Payang is the central traditional market of Kuala Terengganu and has long been a key economic and social hub.

- A hub for traditional industries such as batik and songket

Its location near the Terengganu River made it strategically important for trade and daily commerce.

MOSQUES

MASJID KRISTAL



The Crystal Mosque is one of the most iconic landmarks in Terengganu, located within Taman Tamadun Islam on Wan Man Island. It was officially opened in 2008 during the reign of Sultan Mizan Zainal Abidin.

The mosque is unique for its modern architecture, constructed using glass, steel, and crystal, which gives it a reflective, luminous appearance especially at night. It symbolizes the integration of Islamic tradition with modern technology.

In addition to being a place of worship, the mosque is equipped with digital facilities, including internet access and electronic Qur'an systems, reflecting its role as a "smart mosque."

MASJID TENGGU TENGAH ZAHARAH

The Floating Mosque, officially known as Masjid Tengku Tengah Zaharah, was completed in 1995 and is one of the earliest floating mosques in Malaysia.

Built over a lagoon near the coast, the mosque appears to float on water, especially during high tide. Its architecture combines modern Islamic design with Moorish influences, creating a serene and visually striking structure.

It was named after Tengku Tengah Zaharah, the mother of Sultan Mizan Zainal Abidin, and serves both as a religious and architectural landmark.



MASJID ABIDIN (MASJID PUTIH)



Masjid Abidin, also known as the White Mosque, is the **oldest mosque** in Kuala Terengganu, originally built in the 18th century during the reign of Sultan Zainal Abidin II.

The mosque has undergone several renovations, blending traditional Malay architecture with colonial and modern influences. Despite these changes, it remains an important symbol of Islamic development in the state.

Historically, it served as a central religious institution, hosting prayers, Islamic teachings, and community gatherings.

MASJID TOK JEMBAL

Masjid Tok Jembal is a local community mosque located near the Tok Jembal area, close to UMT.

Unlike major landmark mosques, it reflects the everyday religious life of local residents. It plays an important role in:

- Daily prayers
- Community bonding
- Religious education at the grassroots level

Its simpler architecture emphasizes functionality and accessibility, rather than monumentality.



MASJID UNIVERSITI MALAYSIA TERENGGANU



The UMT Mosque is the main mosque within Universiti Malaysia Terengganu (UMT) and serves as a central hub for religious activities on campus.

It provides:

- Daily congregational prayers
- Friday prayers (Jumu'ah)
- Religious talks and student programs

The mosque reflects a modern campus design, prioritizing accessibility and comfort for students, including international students.

MASJID UNIVERSITI SULTAN ZAINAL ABIDIN

The UniSZA Mosque is one of the largest university mosques in Terengganu and is known for its grand scale and elegant Islamic architecture.

It serves not only students but also the surrounding community, hosting:

- Religious lectures
- Community events
- Islamic educational programs

Its spacious design allows it to accommodate a large number of worshippers, especially during major events.

EXPLORE TERENGGANU

NASI DAGANG

Tradisional Food



Nasi dagang is a traditional dish from Terengganu made from a mixture of white rice and glutinous rice that is steamed with coconut milk, giving it a rich and fragrant flavour. It is served with aromatic tuna curry, pickled cucumber and carrots, and usually accompanied by a boiled egg. The rice is first cooked with coconut milk until fluffy before being served with the hot curry and side dishes.

KEREPOK LEKOR

Tradisional Food



This Terengganu food is made from a blend of ground fish-usually herring, ikan tamban (a type of herring), ikan kerisi (threadfin bream) or ikan selayang (mackerel scad)-and sago flour, this traditional fish sausage is seasoned with salt and rolled into long, cylindrical shapes before being boiled and then, deep-fried to golden perfection and is often served with a sweet chili sauce. It's a typical tea time snack for the locals and can with or without the sauce.

NASI KERABU

Tradisional Food



Nasi Kerabu consists of bright blue tinted rice, usually eaten with ulam, fried salted fish, fish crackers and other garnishing. The rice is blue due to the petals of the butterfly pea flower or Clitoria ternatea (bunga telang in Malay). All the ingredients of this Terengganu food are made separately and the served together on one plate.

SATA

Tradisional Food



This food is made from spiced fish, shallots and ginger, pounded and mixed together. The mixture is then wrapped in a banana leaf and slowly grilled over hot coal.

NEKBAT

Tradisional Food



Nekbat is a sweet dessert made from rice flour and eggs. The ingredients are usually mixed and poured into moulds, covered with a lid and cooked until it's spongy and cream in colour. Once it's done cooking, the plain nekbat is boiled in sugar water for a few minutes to give it a sweet taste.

CELUP TEPUNG

Tradisional Food



Fish, squid, and prawns in batter are prepared using fresh seafood that is cleaned first. Then, the ingredients are coated with a batter mixture made from flour, spices, and a little water. Next, they are deep-fried in hot oil until golden brown and crispy. This dish is usually served hot with chilli sauce or a spicy dipping sauce.

LEMPENG NYIOR

Tradisional Food



Lempeng nyior is a traditional dish made from a mixture of flour, coconut milk, and a pinch of salt. The batter is stirred until well combined, then poured onto a hot pan and cooked until lightly golden. The pancake is made thin and flipped to ensure both sides are evenly cooked. It is usually served hot with sugar, sambal, or side dishes according to taste.

LAKSA TERENGGANU (KUAH MERAH)

Tradisional Food



Laksa Kuah Merah is a traditional dish from Terengganu made with laksa noodles served with a red-colored gravy. The gravy is prepared using grated coconut flesh that is squeezed for its milk, along with spices that give it a rich, creamy, and slightly spicy taste. The laksa noodles are first blanched before being served with the hot gravy. This dish is usually completed with herbs and side ingredients such as eggs and fish.

LAKSA TERENGGANU (KUAH PUTIH) *Tradisional Food*



Laksa Kuah Putih is a traditional dish from Terengganu made with laksa noodles served in a white gravy. The gravy is prepared using coconut milk and blended spices, giving it a rich, creamy, and savoury flavour. The laksa noodles are first blanched before being served with the hot coconut-based gravy. This dish is usually enjoyed with fresh herbs and side ingredients such as fish, eggs, and vegetables.

LAKSAM *Tradisional Food*



Laksam is a traditional dish from Terengganu made with thick, flat rice noodles that are rolled and cut into bite-sized pieces. The noodles are served in a rich, creamy white gravy made from coconut milk and boiled fish, giving it a smooth and savoury flavour. The noodles are first prepared and arranged before being generously covered with the hot gravy. This dish is usually enjoyed with fresh herbs and condiments for added taste.

KETUPAT SOTONG *Tradisional Food*



This intriguing dish features steamed squids meticulously stuffed with glutinous rice and then served with cooked coconut milk. The combination creates a harmonious fusion of sweet, creamy and subtly briny flavours on the palate. Locals tend to have ketupat sotong for afternoon tea and it is commonly found during the squid season, which is post-monsoon from April to June.

PULUT LEPA *Tradisional Food*



Pulut lepa is a beloved savoury snack made from pounded fish and grated coconut. The blend of sweet and savoury flavours is then rolled in glutinous rice. Shaped like a sausage, it's then carefully wrapped in banana leaf and grilled over a charcoal flame for that distinct aroma and flavour.

LOMPAT TIKAM

Tradisional Food



This vibrant two-layered dessert is a feast for the eyes, though the name lompat tikam menacingly translates to 'jump and stab'. Perhaps it was to hint at how delicious the snack is that people had to stab a fork through for a portion quickly! Made from coconut milk and rice flour, the base gets its colour (and sweet fragrance) from pandan leaves, while the top is white in contrast. Served with gula Melaka (palm sugar syrup)

JALA MAS

Tradisional Food



Jala (net) mas (gold) is a delicate dessert made from a generous combination of duck egg yolks and sugar. To create this intricate golden net, the mixture is strained through a colander into a pot of hot syrup to harden.

AKOK

Tradisional Food



Akok is a dense and sweet cake made from a mixture of eggs, thick coconut milk, flour and palm sugar. The batter is then poured into small, cylindrical moulds and cooked in a brass pot until it achieves its golden brown wrinkled texture. While it may look similar to bebang, akok is best described as a hybrid between a kuih bakar and an egg tart.

KAYU KERAMAT

Tradisional Food



Kayu keramat is a traditional snack from Terengganu made from glutinous rice flour that is mixed with coconut milk and a pinch of salt. The mixture is shaped into small pieces and then deep-fried until golden brown and crispy on the outside while remaining soft inside. It is usually enjoyed as a light snack and often served with tea or coffee.

PULUT NYIOR

Tradisional Food



Pulut nyior is a traditional breakfast dish from Terengganu made from glutinous rice cooked with coconut water and a pinch of salt, giving it a light savoury flavour. Once cooled, the rice is shaped into large balls and topped with roasted rice and freshly grated coconut. It is usually enjoyed with side dishes such as grilled fish or salted fish for a balanced and satisfying meal.

DODOL PALAS

Tradisional Food



Unlike the dodol one might commonly find in souvenir shops, dodol palas is a traditional Terengganu snack that is harder to find these days. The sticky and sweet toffee-like treat is made from palm sugar and is distinguishable by its larger wrapping of smoked fan palm leaves.

ROJAK KATEH

Tradisional Food



Rojak kateh is one of the most popular Terengganu delicacies. Chewy in texture and sour and spicy in taste, it features cow's leg meat (and sometimes tendon) that has been boiled with peppered vinegar for several hours. Due to its laborious cooking process, this highly sought-after delicacy remains a favourite even among the locals.

TART NANGKA (JACKFRUIT TART)

Tradisional Food



Tart nangka (or jackfruit tart) is a delicate pastry with a doughy bread-like exterior. At its heart is pureed jackfruit cooked with sugar, flour and butter. Together, it becomes a fragrant and slightly chewy snack with a hint of tropical fruitiness.

TERENGGANU SLANG

Gostan (Go stand)

In Terengganu slang, “gostan” (sometimes spelled gostang) is a commonly used informal word that means to move backwards or reverse. It is equivalent to “mengundur” in standard Malay and “reverse” in English.

Gohek (Go ahead)

In Terengganu daily speech, “gohek” is closely associated with the physical action of cycling, especially among locals when talking casually about riding a bicycle.

Lek-lek (look alike)

In Terengganu conversation, “lek-lek” is a casual way to point out resemblance, often used when comparing faces, family members, or even objects that appear similar.

Pereh (press)

In daily Terengganu speech, “pereh” is often used in driving contexts, specifically to tell someone to speed up by pressing the accelerator.

Putih-lepuk = really white/fair

In Terengganu daily speech, “putih-lepuk” adds emphasis, making the description stronger than just “putih,” often used in a casual or expressive way.

Busuk-kohong = so smelly

In everyday Terengganu speech, “busuk-kohong” intensifies the meaning of “busuk,” making it more expressive and vivid.

TELEPHONE & INTERNET

As of 2026, the Gong Badak district UMT is a high-speed telecommunications zone fully covered by 5G-Advanced. Most residential areas (Taman) are equipped with high-speed fiber optics supporting up to 2Gbps. While mainland coverage is robust, connectivity on the islands (Redang/Perhentian) remains primarily 4G.

The regional hub for Maxis/Hotlink support, official student device bundles, and fiber inquiries.

Where to Get It: Ground Floor, Lot No. 52500, Jalan Austin 3.

Stop Point: Located within the Dataran Austin commercial block.

Cost: Reloads start from RM 10.00.

What Time: 10:00 AM – 7:00 PM (Opens 2:30 PM on Fridays).



SIFU TECH GONG BADAK (HARDWARE HUB)

Technical platform for buying hardware like pocket Wi-Fi modems, routers, and accessories.

Where to Get It: No. 6, Lot 25828, Taman Sri Noor (Jalan Gong Badak).

Stop Point: A short drive from the UMT main gate.

Cost: Hardware prices vary; accessories from RM 15.00.

What Time: 8:30 AM – 10:00 PM (Longest hours in the area).



DISASTER MITIGATION:

FLOOD



Flooding is one of the most common and serious natural disasters in Terengganu, especially during the Northeast Monsoon season (October–March). It is mainly caused by:

- Continuous heavy rainfall
- Overflow of rivers and drainage systems
- Low-lying coastal and river basin areas
- High tide phenomena combined with rain

Floods in Malaysia affect a large portion of the population, with millions exposed to risk, and are difficult to avoid due to increasing development in flood-prone areas.



FLOOD - PRONE AREAS

Flooding in Terengganu typically occurs in:

a) River Basin & Low-Lying Areas

- Areas near major rivers such as Sungai Besut, Sungai Kemaman
- Villages located in valleys and floodplains

b) Coastal & Estuary Areas

- Locations near river mouths and the sea
- Affected by high tide + heavy rain combination

c) Frequently Affected Districts

Based on recent data, flood-prone areas include:

- Kuala Terengganu (e.g., Kampung Kubang Ikan, Kuala Ibai)
- Kuala Nerus (e.g., Seberang Takir, Ulu Takir)
- Besut (e.g., Kampung Keruak, Kampung La)
- Setiu (e.g., Kampung Hulu Seladang, Lubuk Panjang)
- Dungun & Kemaman (major flood impact zones)

FLOOD PREPARATION

BEFORE Flood (Preparation)

- Monitor weather updates
- Prepare emergency kit:
 - Documents
 - Food & water
 - Power bank
- Know evacuation routes




DURING Flood

- Follow authorities (NADMA/JPS)
- Move to higher ground
- Do NOT walk/drive through floodwater

AFTER Flood

- Avoid contaminated water
- Check safety before returning
- Maintain hygiene
